Bartow is Polk County's Capital City that provides public safety services for local, regional, state and Federal buildings and surrounding communities.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The City of Bartow's (City) goal is to protect, save lives and property with appropriate fire rescue emergency and training facilities. Funds used for a feasibility study that is needed to analyze and provide the City with relevant data to make informed decisions to the fire department's future staffing, facility's needs for appropriate public safety fire rescue emergency services and training to efficiently and effectively house, train and conduct life-saving emergency services. Current station is antiquated, built in 1960 leaks, has mold issues, and is inadequate for the current demands.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Activities include seeking professional architectural/engineering services adhering to the City's procurement policies and procedures to conduct a feasibility study.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Once the study is completed, the City will move forward based on data driven results with the appropriate location/design for a fire rescue station and training facility to provide efficient and effective fire rescue emergency services to ensure protection of life, health and safety of the citizenry, residential/commercial properties, including regional, State, Federal and local government properties and the environment.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population is the City of Bartow which serves Polk County's Capital City, citizenry, visitors and travelers including Regional, Federal and State offices, agencies, properties and buildings, which are tax exempt creating a reduction of revenue that is needed to adequately serve its citizenry and surrounding communities. It is estimated more than 100,000 individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected benefit is a completed study that provides data driven analysis for the appropriate size and location for the City of Bartow to make informed decision to provide public safety emergency services, housing and training of first responders in order to address the current/future demands, growing population on a daily basis and during severe emergency disaster storm events.
