13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The Heartland Youth Village campus is in need of significant repairs and renovations for existing shelter & group homes/buildings where collaborating partners provide safety, stability and caring relationships to nurture and heal hurting children and teenagers in the foster care system with high needs that have experienced trauma as a result of child abuse and neglect. This will also allow Heartland for Children to increase bed capacity in two vacant homes for up to 8 local children in foster care so they can remain in the same circuit (local communities).

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Repairs and renovations will be provided to 2 vacant homes and other existing shelter & group homes/buildings that operate to serve foster children on the Heartland Youth Village campus. The 2 vacant homes will be established to serve up to 8 additional local children as a placement option. The homes at the Heartland Youth Village will serve high needs youth with emotional or behavioral health disorders. Existing homes, such as the shelter and group home will continue to provide care for children in foster care.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct placement services will be provided to children in the foster care system that are placed in a home on the Heartland Youth Village campus that would include supervision by staff/house parents, basic needs, transportation, normalcy activities and mentoring for high needs youth that are in the foster care system and at-risk or involved with law enforcement or the juvenile justice system. Referrals will be made for any service that is needed for the child that is not provided by the placement provider.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served are children in the foster care system that have been removed from their homes in Polk, Highlands and Hardee counties due to abuse, neglect and/or abandonment. These may include children with poor mental/physical health, homeless, at-risk youth, developmentally delayed, victims of crime, economically disadvantaged, and grade school/high school students. The Shelter, Group Homes and enhanced Family Foster Homes could serve over 150 children in a 12-month period depending on the permanency plan for each child.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

-95% of children in out-of-home care will receive medical and dental services that is measured through the Community Based Care Lead Agency Scorecard established by the Department of Children and Families.

-Children will improve their mental health by being referred to mental health providers to receive the appropriate mental health services based on their mental health needs which is measured by the referrals made to providers, assessments completed by providers, medication management and treatment plans to improve their mental well-being.

-Children will be provided supervision by trained staff 7 days a week that will provide structure and activities to minimize runaways and criminal activity which is measured by incident reports.

-Children will receive recreational, educational and daily living activities to improve social skills and build self-esteem and will be measured through multi-disciplinary team staffings and contract monitoring.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Performance should be based on the completion of repairs and renovations on the Heartland Youth Village campus in order to pass inspections and meet all licensing standards. Standard contract penalties are sufficient.
