The City's current sewer line will be extended on West 9th Street to finish connecting 9th Street and include Palmetto Ave, Flr Ave and Overocker Circle. This will service current residences with septic tanks as well as future development that is in planning phases for development.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct service that will be provided to the citizens of Frostproof by this funding is a safe and less harmful way of removing wastewater while improving the quality of their ground water and lakes.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The targeted population is the general population of a REDI designated community. The targeted population is 43 homes, with an approximate amount of 90-100 residents with the opportunity of connecting an additional 50-100 homes once the new development begins. In addition to the amount of residents, the lake is visited by many outside the city and county. The hundreds of visitors Lake Clinch receives on the weekend helps aid in our economic growth. Local businesses benefit greatly from the visitors of the lake. We hope our lake's quality continues to be a destination our residents, and out of towners, can enjoy.

The expected benefit is to remove septic tanks and connect homes to city sewer. By doing this it will ultimately reduce the amount of septic tanks in the ground, which will lead to less total nitrogen in the ground water that will end up in the surrounding lakes, specifically Lake Clinch. By extending the sewer line in the area proposed, it will also extend the sewer line closer to undeveloped land that has near future plans for residential development. This will also prevent more septic tanks in the ground with new development.
