a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The requested funds will be used to construct a permanent, professional police substation in the Alley District along Tamiami Trail. This facility will serve as a critical law enforcement hub, improving emergency response times, crime deterrence, and public safety in a high-traffic corridor.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The substation will reduce response times for accidents and crimes, improve traffic management, and serve as a multi-agency hub for coordinating with state and federal law enforcement. Officers will provide crime prevention, road safety enforcement, and victim assistance services, ensuring a secure environment for residents, travelers, and first responders. The facility will also support disaster response efforts and public safety education programs, strengthening regional security and emergency preparedness.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The Miccosukee Police Substation will provide rapid emergency response, crime prevention, and traffic enforcement along Tamiami Trail, ensuring public safety for residents and travelers. Officers will respond to accidents and crimes, deter illegal activities, enforce traffic laws, and assist victims. The facility will also serve as a safe space for distressed individuals, support multi-agency law enforcement operations, and coordinate disaster response efforts, enhancing security and emergency preparedness in the region.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The Miccosukee Police Substation will serve thousands of individuals annually, including residents, travelers, commuters, and tourists along Tamiami Trail (I-75). It will provide emergency response, crime prevention, and public safety services to Miami-Dade, Collier, Broward, Hendry, and Highlands Counties. The facility will also support law enforcement personnel, crime victims, and individuals in distress, ensuring a safer and more secure environment in this high-traffic corridor.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The Miccosukee Police Substation will enhance public safety, reduce emergency response times, deter crime, and improve traffic management along Tamiami Trail (I-75). Outcomes will be measured through response time records, crime and traffic reports, community feedback, and multi-agency collaboration data, ensuring effective law enforcement and a safer environment for residents and travelers.
