4. Project/Program Description

The North Bay Village Outfall Valves Upgrade Phase I will install specialized duckbill-style backflow prevention devices throughout the Village's stormwater infrastructure system. These devices will be strategically placed on 22 of the Village's drainage structures along the seawall to prevent unwanted backflow that can cause surcharging and flooding during storm events. The valves feature a maintenance-free design with no mechanical parts or fasteners that could fail or corrode, utilizing multiple natural and synthetic elastomers for heavy-duty construction. The project will help protect residential and commercial areas from flooding while reducing maintenance costs and preventing damage to the stormwater infrastructure system.

### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

These funds will achieve enhanced flood protection for North Bay Village through the installation of state-of-the-art backflow prevention valves. The project will prevent tidal waters and storm surge from backing up through the stormwater system, protecting roads, homes, and businesses from flooding while preserving the integrity of the Village's infrastructure.



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**b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?**

The project will involve engineering analysis of the 22 priority outfall locations, procurement of appropriate valve sizes and specifications, installation of duckbill check valves at identified outfall points, and post-installation testing to ensure proper operation.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

This project will provide critical flood protection services to the community by preventing tidal backflow and storm surge from entering the stormwater system. The installations will operate automatically based on pressure differential, requiring no external power or manual intervention, while allowing normal stormwater drainage to continue unimpeded during regular conditions.

**d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?**

The target population served by this project is the entire population of North Bay Village. About 10,000 individuals are expected to be served.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

The expected outcomes include reduced flooding incidents, decreased infrastructure damage, and lower maintenance costs. Success will be measured through monitoring of flood incidents before and after installation, tracking maintenance requirements and costs, and conducting regular inspections to verify proper valve operation and effectiveness.
