Combating human trafficking activities; developing and implementing an advanced AI-driven solution for Law enforcement; providing actionable intelligence to help identify and prosecute buyers and support victims; educating potential buyers to mitigate and stop the purchase before it happens, and promoting safe on-line behaviors. Measurements: reduction in victims and arrests; increased protection for women and girls (78% of victims).
