a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The primary objective is to provide comprehensive training and education in the field of theatre arts. The goal is to equip young artists with the necessary skills and knowledge to excel in the theatre industry. A portion of the funds will be allocated to provide scholarships for promising high school students. These scholarships will enable talented individuals to attend theatre camps and receive financial support for their college education. The specific goal is to remove financial barriers that may otherwise hinder these students from pursuing a career in theatre. The funds will also be used to provide paid work opportunities for apprentices on stage and behind the scenes. This "earn while you learn" approach allows young artists to gain practical experience.

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Acting and Vocal Training: Comprehensive training in acting and singing techniques.

Apprentice-Type Activities: Hands-on experiences in various theatre roles.

Paid Work Opportunities: Apprentices earn while gaining professional experience.

Scholarships: Financial support for high school students to attend theatre camps and college.

Training Services: Sharing expertise with other theatre organizations.

Diverse Training: Tailored programs for a wide range of theatre interests

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This project directly serves citizens by offering acting and vocal training, hands-on apprentice activities, scholarships for high school students attending theatre camps and college, paid work opportunities on and offstage, training services for other theatre organizations, financial support to enable apprentices from other theaters to attend camps, and inclusive programming for individuals aged 13 to 21. This comprehensive initiative aims to nurture young artistic talent, enhance job skills, and enrich the theatre workforce in Central Florida while fostering collaboration within the regional theatre community. It also helps to provide a space to improve positive mental health through it collaboration and theatre work.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The program is designed to serve individuals aged 13 to 21 who are passionate about theatre and seeking careers within the industry. While the exact number of participants may vary annually, the program is expected to accommodate a diverse group of exceptionally talented young adults. Additionally, the program's expansion plans aim to create space for an additional 60 students, further enhancing its impact on the growth and development of the theatre workforce in Central Florida while providing opportunities for both apprentices and aspiring theatre professionals in the region.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The program encompass comprehensive skill development, paid work opportunities in theatre, scholarships, and the expansion of the theatre workforce in Central Florida. These outcomes will be measured by evaluating participants' skill development and career progression, tracking the number of program graduates who secure paid roles or continue their education, and assessing the impact of collaborations and financial support provided to other theaters in the region.
