4. Project/Program Description

This project addresses stormwater improvements along the City's 10th Ave South and Dixie Highway in adjacent areas separated by railroad track. For the area west of the railroad, drainage conveyances that direct storm flows under the railroad easement cannot meet level of service (LOS) during storm events. East of the tracks, LOS deficiencies extend along Dixie Highway from 8th Ave South to 10th Ave South. These flood locations are nonpoint sources of pollutants that negatively impact the water quality of Lake Worth Lagoon, the receiving waterbody. The project will implement Best Management Practices (BMP) - exfiltration trenches, upsized reinforced concrete pipes, curb inlets, and nutrient separating baffle boxes - to improve drainage and reduce nutrient discharge.
