13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Hardening of infrastructure at one of the county's public safety communications towers will result in quicker response times for first responders, resulting in greater public safety and wellbeing of residents. The upgrades will also support stronger connectivity among public safety radio channels, ensuring communication is uninterrupted and secure. This project will support each first responder, and in turn citizen, of Washington and surrounding counties.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Upgrades to the tower will ensure first responders throughout Washington County are able to respond and communicate immediately in the event of an accident, natural disaster or emergency. First responders' radio channels will be secure, leading to uninterrupted service and quick response times.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Law enforcement services, emergency medical services (EMS), fire services, emergency communications, transportation safety, and disaster and emergency management services will be enhanced by this funding request, provide a direct service to all citizens within the county.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elderly persons, persons with poor mental and/or physical health, developmentally and/or physically disabled, currently or formerly incarcerated persons, drug offenders (in criminal justice), victims of crime, and the general public. Over 800 individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improved mental and physical health, measured by tracking the increase in emergency calls received following the infrastructure upgrades, as well as the improvement in response times. The number of crisis intervention responses can be monitored, as well as the progress of individuals dealing with mental health issues after the intervention. Funding will help protect the general public from harm and improve transportation conditions as the number of traffic incidents, road closures reported, and number of public traffic advisories can be monitored. Traffic flow efficiency can be tracked, as well as travel time and emergency response time. Traffic activity during weather events can also be monitored.
