The funds requested will be used to construct a new fire station in Brooker, establishing essential fire and emergency medical services for the area. The goal is to reduce emergency response times from 15 minutes to under eight minutes, ensuring timely and effective intervention in fires, medical emergencies, and accidents. This station will also enhance community safety through fire prevention education, improve emergency preparedness, and provide a base for local emergency response teams. Ultimately, the purpose is to safeguard lives, property, and the environment while supporting community resilience.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will be used to build and equip the Brooker Fire Station, enabling rapid response to fires, medical emergencies, and rescue operations. It will reduce response times, minimize property damage, and improve public safety. The station will also offer community education on fire prevention and emergency preparedness, while providing ongoing training for fire and EMS personnel to maintain effective response capabilities. This project will enhance safety and well-being in the Brooker community.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The appropriation will directly provide citizens in Brooker with faster emergency response times, including fire suppression, medical services, and rescue operations. It will also offer fire safety education and emergency preparedness programs to enhance community awareness. The station will serve as a local hub for emergency services, ensuring residents have immediate access to trained professionals and life-saving resources, ultimately improving public safety and well-being.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population served by this project is the residents of Brooker and the surrounding areas, including individuals, families, and local businesses. This includes all ages, with a focus on ensuring rapid emergency response and enhanced public safety for those in need of fire, medical, or rescue services. The project will also benefit visitors and travelers passing through the area by reducing response times and improving overall community preparedness. Approximately 29,000 citizens.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project is a significant reduction in emergency response times, from an average of 15 minutes to under five minutes, leading to improved outcomes in fire suppression, medical interventions, and rescue operations. This will enhance public safety, reduce property damage, and save lives. The outcome will be measured by tracking response times before and after the fire station is operational, using fire department reporting software. Additionally, the number of emergency incidents, successful interventions, and community feedback will be collected to assess improvements in safety and overall service delivery.
