4. Project/Program Description

The Town of Brooker (Town) requests the reversion and reappropriation of Specific Appropriation 2489A, Brooker New Fire Apparatus, as funded in the FY 24-25 GAA. The Town has experienced a delay in receiving the funded apparatus. The Town has a goal to procure new fire apparatus in order to staff a full-time career paid fire station. The Town of Brooker is one of the most rural portions of Bradford County with fire and EMS response taking a minimum of 15 minutes from the closest station. Funding this request will result in shorter response times, greatly expanding and improving the Fire and EMS service to the community.

he Town of Brooker (Town) requests the reversion and reappropriation of Specific Appropriation 2489A, Brooker New Fire Apparatus, as funded in the FY 24-25 GAA. The funds will be used to purchase new fire apparatus to equip the Brooker Fire Station, ensuring that the station has the necessary vehicles for fire suppression, emergency medical services, and rescue operations. 
