Sewer Force Main Improvements: Installation of a exfiltration drainage system; Installation of signs and pavement markings and traffic management.

Flooding is limiting the economic, social and environmental development of the city and its consequences are be considerable: in addition to direct damage to property and infrastructure (roadways, utilities and services). Sewer backups are often from the sanitary sewer system, which takes on some storm water as a result of Infiltration/Inflow

-Protect the general public from harm: The elimination of the flooding conditions would serve to reduce damage to properties that are created when these major commercial areas are flooded and become impassable.
 -Enhance/preserve/improve the environment: The significant amounts of impervious surface in the city of Opa-locka collects pollutants during storms or rain event, without a proper drainage system deposits them straight into our waterbodies.
