The Leslie Estates neighborhood experiences flooding during modest to heavy rainfall events. The project will involve the installation of drainage structures and pipes to provide flood relief and improved water quality for residents of the community. This project is part of the City's overall resiliency efforts to create healthy and livable communities. This project will increase the drainage capacity for storm-water runoff within the neighborhood, thereby reducing roadway flooding, increase safety and mitigate the likelihood of property damage and personal injury. The project has been designed and currently in the permitting phase. The project is anticipated to be shovel ready when fund appropriation is approved.

# Incidence of flooding of roadways and properties will be mitigated. Installation of ex-filtration trenches as part of the improvements for treatment of stormwater runoff resulting in improved water quality discharged into canals and other water bodies. The outcome will be measured by sampling and measuring levels of concentration of pollutants in canals and other water bodies
