### 4. Project/Program Description

Metropolitan Ministries' C.R.E.A.T.E. program will serve 300 children and 200 parents with quality childcare in West Pasco on the U.S.19 Corridor. The area currently lacks enough childcare providers to meet community need. The program will be open from 6:30am-6:00 pm, providing working parents with a safe place for children to learn and grow while they work. Through C.R.E.A.T.E. (Children's Recreation Education Arts and Therapeutic Experience), children ages 0-18 build a solid foundation so they are ready to learn and succeed in school. Eight early learning classrooms will provide developmentally appropriate instruction and resources for children 0-6 to develop early reading, math, and socialization skills needed for school. Our out-of-school time program for school age students blends traditional after-school and summer camp activities with academic support, STEAM, and interactive life-skills lessons.

### 13. Program Performance

### a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

C.R.E.A.T.E. (Children's Recreation Education Arts and Therapeutic Experience) brings quality childcare to 300 children ages 0-18 on the U.S. 19 corridor in West Pasco County. This area currently does not have enough available childcare providers to meet the need. Daycare and out-of-school time care will allow parents to obtain and maintain employment and children to access supplemental resources, educational enhancements and experiences that help them learn and succeed in school and life.



### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Metropolitan Ministries will provide quality childcare and developmentally appropriate activities and services designed to support children's ability to learn and succeed in school. Services include: developmentally appropriate curriculum and teaching in the classroom, developmental screening and linkages, executive function interventions, STEAM exposure, enrichment field trips, life skills lessons, academic support and tutoring, and parenting support and instruction.

### c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Pasco citizens will have access to quality affordable childcare for 300 children ages 0-18 along the U.S.19 Corridor. The Early Learning Center (complete March 2025) will hold 8 classrooms where students will build school readiness skills in literacy and math. C.R.E.A.T.E. out of school time (after care and summer camp for school age students) blends STEAM, academic support, and life skills.

### d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for this project is homeless and low-income children and parents living in West Pasco County. 300 children and 200 parents will be served. In West Pasco's Holiday community, 26% of children live in poverty and only 25% of all 3-4-year-olds are currently in childcare (2020 Census). 210 Holiday residents surveyed fall 2023 rated their biggest challenges as maintaining employment due to lack of affordable childcare.
