#### 13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

To design and construct a new jail that meets code and standards established for inmate populations. The current jail is over 30 years old, damaged and is out of compliance to meet current inmate populations requirements and is not able to withstand hurricane force winds or severe storm events. The building leaks, floods and has mold issues.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Activities include seeking contractual preliminary architectural/engineering, design, bidding, permitting, project management, administration, engineering during construction and construction services based on competitive procurement policies and procedures.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Citizens are better served with a new jail creating a safer, more secure, and positive environment that leads to less liability on the County and vicariously upon the tax payers. Environment encouraging the recovery and improvement of those incarcerated to increase the probability of becoming productive and contributing members of the community.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Hardee County, which is a financially disadvantaged community (ch. 62-552, F.A.C.) that is located in a Rural Area of Opportunity (s. 288.0656, Florida Statutes), citizenry, visitors, tourists, business community and surrounding areas. Greater than 27,000 expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Benefit is protection of life, health and safety of first responders and law enforcement personnel with appropriate accommodations and adequate jail facilities to safely process offenders, properly receive and house the volume of inmates and to deter the spread of COVID-19, protection of visitors and the general public, as well as the opportunity to rehabilitate offenders to reduce recidivism and substance abuse.
