The project proposes to install 25 emergency bypass pumps at key/critical lift stations within the Lehigh Acres wastewater collection system. This service area is located within the Caloosahatchee Basin. The bypass pumps provide extra pumping capacity at select lift stations to handle the rapid increase in wastewater flow during storms and other natural disasters that cause heavy flooding. This project will mitigate the potential for Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSOs) and protect the environment.

Prevent of Sanitary Sewer Overflows as a result of excessive flows entering the sewer system will be provided to the community of Lehigh Acres.

The Lehigh Acres community is the target population. The current customer base is approximately 14,000 accounts.

The main benefit of this project is to prevent Sanitary Sewer Overflows as a result of excessive flows entering the sewer system. Preventing SSOs reduces the likelihood of raw sewage entering the surrounding surface waters and community.

The suggested penalty for not meeting the deliverables is to refund the FDEP 20% of the total funding received for each calendar year past the project completion date, not to exceed 100% of the total funding amount.
