a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds requested will specifically achieve the goal of enhancing the physical and emotional well-being of individuals with disabilities and veterans through access to therapeutic boating and fishing programs.

These funds will enable the Freedom Waters Foundation to:

Expand Program Reach: Increase the number of participants served, allowing more individuals to benefit from therapeutic experiences that promote relaxation and stress relief.

Volunteer Recruitment and Training: Recruit and develop additional marine specialized volunteers to support participants and train them on supporting individuals with special needs.

Create Community Connections**: Facilitate family engagement events and social activities that strengthen relationships and build a supportive community around participants.

Ultimately, the funds will empower individuals to lead healthier, more fulfilling lives while fostering a sense of belonging and connection with others.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

FWF will provide services including therapeutic boating experiences, guided fishing trips, and educational workshops on water safety and fishing techniques. Supportive recreational activities will encourage teamwork and social interaction, while family engagement events will strengthen bonds among participants. These initiatives aim to enhance quality of life for individuals with special needs.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Despite their proximity to the sea, many of our participants have never experienced the therapeutic value of boating. This funding will directly support accessible boating. We have access to 90+ volunteered vessels that accommodate a range of special needs and disabilities, allowing every participant an opportunity to experience the healing properties of being on the water.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population for the Freedom Waters Foundation includes individuals with disabilities and veterans. These groups often face unique challenges that can impact their physical and emotional well-being, making access to therapeutic and recreational activities essential for their development and healing.

With the funding requested, the foundation aims to serve approximately 1500 Collier County based individuals annually. This includes providing therapeutic boating and fishing experiences, educational workshops, and community engagement activities. By focusing on these specific populations, the Freedom Waters Foundation seeks to create a positive impact on their quality of life, promote social inclusion, and foster resilience through meaningful outdoor experiences.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project is to significantly improve the physical and emotional well-being of participants, including individuals with disabilities and veterans. The project aims to foster greater social connections, enhance selfesteem, and promote physical activity through therapeutic boating and fishing experiences. **Expected Outcomes:**

Increased Physical Activity: Participants will engage in more outdoor activities, leading to improved physical health and fitness levels.

Enhanced Emotional Well-Being: Participants will report reduced stress, anxiety, and depression, contributing to overall mental health improvement.

Stronger Social Connections: Participants will develop friendships and support networks, reducing feelings of isolation and loneliness.
