In 2022 and 2024 there were three major flood events in the City of Naples requiring 911 response to be delayed until after flood waters receded. With the purchase of this apparatus and funding provided by the state the City of Naples Fire-Rescue Department will be able to respond to 911 calls during times of flood.

The intended purpose of these funds is to purchase a high water response suppression vehicle capable of responding to 911 calls through flood waters. The responses will consist of medical, fire, hazardous materials, and flood rescue calls.

The target population for this project is the 20,000 City of Naples residents and 400,000 residents of Collier County. While the primary responsibility of the City of Naples Fire-Rescue Department is the residents of the City of Naples, the agency is part of a county wide closest unit agreement. If this apparatus is available and 911 call is received it will be dispatched outside of the City to service residents and guests of the County.

The high water engine is expected to the reduce the number of 911 calls pushed until after the flood waters recede. In most situations areas of the City this apparatus would have been able to continue to respond to emergencies during all flood events in recent history.
