This technology helps identify stolen cars, track wanted suspects, and locate missing persons by cross referencing license plate information with law enforcement databases. This enhances the department's efficiency by reducing manual checks and improving situational awareness during investigations and patrol.

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This project will enhance the Naples Police Department's law enforcement and investigative services provided to citizens and result in improved safety and security, and a reduction in crime.

License Plate Readers (LPRs) provide an increase of security for the City and investigative tools to help maintain a safe city for both residents and visitors. The Naples Police Department maintains a reporting method for documenting the use of LPR technology for cases within our RMS system. The information maintained provides a running calculation of crimes which are solved or cases which involve the use of LPRs.
