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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The inspHire program supports Florida's strategies to reduce incarceration costs and the prison population for sustainable savings. Its goal is to deliver returns by desistence, reducing recidivism, decreasing crime, and breaking cycles of hopelessness. Through reentry services and employment, inspHire fosters economic development, job creation, and the growth of self-sufficient, productive members of society.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

re-release needs assessment, a plan-of-care, and referrals for incarcerated participants. inspHire will primarily provide post-release services including assistance with transitional housing, case management, professional development & essential life skills training, family reunification/support, career coaching, computer literacy, substance abuse & mental health aid, and job placement assistance

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Pre-release needs assessment, a plan-of-care, and referrals for incarcerated participants. inspHire will primarily provide post-release services including assistance with transitional housing, case management, professional development & essential life skills training, family reunification/support, career coaching, computer literacy, substance abuse & mental health aid, and job placement assistance

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Services of this project are targeted to individuals with a lived incarceration experience who are on community supervision, or have served time at a Department of Corrections' facility, or participants of any State Attorney's Office Diversion or Pretrial Intervention Programs, or adult ex-offenders who served time in a Department of Juvenile Justice facility. The inspHire comprehensive reentry program may provide post-release services to any individual with a lived incarceration experience who is within travel distance to the inspHire location and transitioning back into the communities and workforce of Hillsborough, Pinellas, Pasco, or Polk counties.

- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?
- 1) Improve physical & mental health Participants will attain pubic healthcare coverage or through their employer; and receive a mental health assessment.
- 2) Reduce Substance Abuse Participant will receive a substance abuse assessment.
- 3) Protect the general public from harm, Divert from Criminal/Juvenile Justice System, & Reduce Recidivism- Formerly incarcerated citizens that are engaged, employed, and empowered are less likely to commit crimes and return to prison.
- 4) Increase & improve economic viability Citizens returning to the community after incarceration will be employed.
- 5) Enhance individual's economic self sufficiency Participants will receive essential life management, employábility, computer and financial literacy training. Participants also receive employment placement assistance.
- *All outcomes are documented in the program's Efforts-to-Outcomes data system, tracked by the Case Manager, and reported to the Department of Corrections monthly & quarterly.
- f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

The Florida Department of Corrections will enforce financial penalties for unmet performance measures outlined in the contract, including client services and milestones. Additional penalties, calculated as percentages of the fiscal year contract value, will apply for late invoice submissions and evaluation ratings as specified in the contract.
