The federal government appropriated \$5 trillion for response to the COVID 19 Pandemic. Florida's share was \$93.3 billion. It is estimated that around 15% of all COVID funding was stolen through fraud, which equates to about \$13.3 billion stolen in Florida. The Florida Fraud Prevention and Detection Center (FPDC) will provide Florida agencies with an enterprise wide system to identify and respond to fraudulent claims made by organized criminal groups and individuals. Response consists of claw back of stolen funds and/or criminal referral.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Providing state agencies with an enterprise wide solution to enhance current anti-fraud activities by developing a system that aggregates data for review and analysis. The combined data from all agencies administering grants and other public assistance activities will enhance the ability to identify organized criminal organizations and individuals stealing from multiple programs across agencies. The program will identify questionable applications, easing the review process for analyst.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Enhance current anti-fraud measures currently used by state agencies managing grant programs and other public assistance activities. Establish an enterprise wide system of data required to identify and analyze suspected cases of fraud by organized criminal activities and individuals.

Increased recovery of funding stolen through fraudulent activities; detection and prevention of fraudulent activities; increase the amount of funding available to applicants in actual need of public assistance funding.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Prevention, detection, and prompt response to fraud perpetrated against state and federal public assistance programs, thereby, ensuring funding is directed to and for those as intended by legislation and individuals needs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Persons and families in need of public assistance for essential needs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Prevention, detection and appropriate response to fraud against public assistance programs. Increase the number of fraud cases identified and prevented. Increase funding available to individuals needing public assistance, through prevention activities and funding claw back activities. Agency reporting of fraud detection and prevention activities comparing previous time period to the current time period. Reporting of funds stolen through fraud, the value of funding recovered by prevention and detection activities.
