Description: According to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, the State of Florida generates approximately 1.1 million tons of residential glass, of which only 18% is reported to be recycled annually. This project would establish regional waste glass collection and processing facilities.

Objective: Develop three regional waste glass processing facilities and create end markets for processed glass aggregate, with a strong focus on local economic development and sustainable market growth. This initiative will position Florida as a leader in sustainable glass recycling while driving economic growth and strengthening local markets for recycled materials.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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This initiative would develop three regional waste glass processing facilities in Florida and create end markets for processed glass aggregate.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Collection of waste glass from curbside recycling programs and drop-off centers, and Goodwill donation off facilities and process waste glass to glass aggregate for use in concrete applications, road base applications as well as in septic drain field applications.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Reduce the amount of waste glass being landfilled in the state of Florida. Increase recycling rate for waste glass and create a viable end market for processed glass aggregate.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida Panhandle, Southeast and Southwest Florida residents. The total population as of the 2020 Census, was 1.5 million, 9.4 million and 2.2 million respectively. Using this figure, the regional populations as percentages of the state's total are: Florida Panhandle: Approximately 6.96%, Southeast Florida: Approximately 44.04%, and Southwest Florida: Approximately 6.99%.

The project will be able to process 10,000 tons of waste glass. This equates to avoided disposal cost savings of \$420,000 per year.

Total tons of materials diverted from landfill as well as the volume of processed glass aggregate created as a result of the project.
