For the state, this program fosters education, accessibility, and participation.

Produce and air segments summarizing key legislative actions, policies, and decisions. Broadcast in both English and Haitian Creole to ensure accessibility for non-English-speaking audiences. Deliver information in a clear, engaging, and culturally relevant format to encourage civic participation. Develop digital tools such as infographics, short-form videos, and social media content.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The program will provide bilingual segments (in English and Creole) that condenses and interprets key government actions from Florida's Statehouse, Cabinet, and agencies. This initiative will ensure that underserved communities, particularly the Haitian and Caribbean populations, have direct access to important legislative, economic, and policy updates in a language.

Underserved American Citizens with a language barrier

Increased Workforce Participation – Understanding labor laws, minimum wage updates, and workers' rights will give more confidence to seek employment, negotiate fair wages, and access job training programs. A suggested methodology is to Track the number of viewers referred to workforce centers, small business programs, or financial assistance services through our media content Collect data on the number of new Haitian owned businesses.
