13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The requested funds will facilitate the construction of a pedestrian bridge linking the Miami Intermodal Center (MIC) to surrounding economic engines. The bridge creates direct access to public transit and commuter rail (Metrorail, Tri-Rail, and Metrobus services). In addition to enhancing economic development and access to jobs, the bridge will help improve transit access, reduce congestion, enhance mobility, and reduce impact to adjacent residences.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The requested funds will facilitate the construction of a pedestrian bridge connecting critical areas to the Miami Intermodal Center, optimizing accessibility and mitigating congestion around Miami International Airport. The project will also upgrade critical infrastructure, including power lines, while boosting transit ridership, mobility, and regional connectivity to support economic growth.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funding will improve accessibility, safety, and mobility by constructing a pedestrian bridge connecting key areas to the Miami Intermodal Center. This project will increase transit use, reduce congestion, and foster economic growth by enhancing access to businesses and recreational spaces, while creating a safer, more efficient transportation link.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Elderly persons; persons with poor mental health; persons with poor physical health; economically disadvantaged persons; at-risk youth; physically disabled; grade school students; high school students; university and college students; the general population. Estimated to serve >800 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefits of this project include improved physical and mental health, enriched cultural experiences, enhanced environmental quality, increased safety, better transportation, economic growth, and job creation. The outcomes will be measured through pedestrian and cyclist counts, park attendance, surveys, traffic studies, and job growth metrics. Public access, usage data, visitor feedback, and environmental assessments will track the effectiveness of these benefits. Additionally, tourism data and cultural event participation will help assess the project's impact on Miami's economy and community well-being.
