a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Nourish Florida's homeschool urban farming initiative blends hands-on education with sustainability and agriculture promotion.



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c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Students cultivate gardens, tend animals and harvest food, gaining skills in agriculture, ecology, and nutrition. The program fosters responsibility, teamwork, and environmental stewardship while promoting healthy eating. By merging home schooling with urban farming. Nourish Florida empowers children to become knowledgeable, compassionate stewards of the earth and their communities

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

At-risk youth; preschool students; grade school students; high school students. Target population served is greater than 800.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Benefit: This project will allow students to gain practical knowledge, with at least 80% demonstrating proficiency in key agricultural skills (composting, crop rotation) after a structured curriculum. Method: Track total produce yield before and after program participation. Benefit: Incrase hand-on learning engagement, with students actively participating in urban farming. Method: Comparison of participation rates in experiential learning activities before and after joining the program.
