Elderly persons; persons with poor physical health; jobless persons; economically disadvantaged persons; at-risk youth; preschool students; grade school students; high school students. Target population greater than 800.

Benefit: Educate the general public about the health benefits of eating healthy. Measure: Survey of participants in the Nourish Florida community food distributions to determine their knowledge on health benefits. Benefit: Alleviate food insecurity thereby reducing potential choices between medicine or/and food and making good health choices. Measure: Interactive training demonstrations, food harvesting, educational activities related to health.
