a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Screening of military veterans for safety and aptitude to become educators. Basic training in personal finance, health and safety and competence as a guest lecturer, substitute teacher, full time educator or founder of a microschool. 33 educators, 120 substitute teachers, 165 guest lecturers. 2 transitional houses near colleges.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Sexual Safety Screening assessment, drug testing, guest speaker academy, substitute teacher academy, Edu-preneur academy and mentoring. Mentoring in transition by a now retired SgtMaj USMC. Dave Ramsey Finance Coaching, Dr. Amen Brain Health Coaching courses, resume and interviewing coaching. Facilitating college visits and employment interviews with districts, charter, and private schools.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

All the same in item 13b plus "Green Patrol" litter clean-ups in environmentally sensitive areas and near water sources. Our participants engage with communities to "have a blast keeping Florida clean, green, and pristine" through litter removal patrols.

- 33 Military veterans (primarily Marines), 120 military veterans to join our substitute teacher pool, 165 military veterans to become guest lecturers in educational settings.
