Ince restored, the Switzerland Community Center will serve as a vocational training facility, offering hands-on instruction a skilled trades such as construction, carpentry, electrical work, and general contracting. The project will also stimulate local economic growth by creating jobs in engineering, construction, and workforce training programs. uccess will be measured by the number of residents utilizing community programs, attendance at educational orkshops, and overall public engagement with center activities.
