Construct a new health/wellness family center in Wesley Chapel. This

state-of-the-art facility will be designed to meet community well-being needs focusing on families, kids, and seniors. During emergencies, the buildings can also be used by local municipalities, providing

shelter and act as a distribution site for supplies/meals.



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As our Pasco County community continues to grow, so do the demands for quality health and well-being programs. To help meet these needs, the Tampa YMCA will construct a new health and wellness family center in Wesley Chapel. The new Y in Wesley Chapel will include a 40,000 sq ft wellness facility as well as a 30,000 sq ft outdoor aquatic center. More than 40,000 families live within minutes of the proposed site for this new YMCA.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Welcoming, fully accessible environment for people of all abilities/ages in pursuit of healthier lifestyle in quality/effective programs; safe, positive space for youth/teens to build character/values in afterschool/teen/sports programs; Drowning Prevention Programs; evidence-based programs to address chronic disease; gathering spaces for community; and more opportunities for families to bond.

The Wesley Chapel Family YMCA will improve physical and mental health. As a community leader in health and wellness, the Tampa Y understands the importance of physical activity and a balanced diet. We will offer group exercise classes, small-group training, and personal training to community members and offer evidence-based health programs for specific chronic diseases.
