a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The area along Canal Avenue just to the east of US Highway 1, is not served by an existing stormwater system. There are commercial buildings, single family homes, and a mobile home park that experiences major flooding issues with any significant rain event. The City desires to construct a gravity system and retention pond from the lowest point to one of the surrounding drainage systems. This will help the residential and commercial properties along with the mobile home park from being severely iinundated with water.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Once the gravity system and retention pond are completed and stability is achieved, the City of Oak HIII will perform quality routine maintenance through public works to ensure that the structures, residential homes and mobile homes and surrounding property are maintained to prevent flooding and environmental hazards.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Once the project is completed, citizens in that area citizens will receive routine maintenace on the system to prevent flooding of their properties and access so that residents can have the ability to drive on the road.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Home owners, mobile home park residents and commercial properties will be served by this project.

Elimination of flooding and access to private property by owners, visitors, and other citizens on what is a well-traveled road as well as consumers who access the commercial properties doing business in the area.
