13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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The purpose of the funds is to enhance safety and save lives. The vessels purchased with these funds will provide advanced life support, marine fire rescue, search and rescue, and assist other agencies with emergency medical and fire suppression services in Atlantic Ocean and Florida Bay that are not currently present within Monroe County Fire Rescue. Establishing marine emergency response capabilities will enable Fire Rescue personnel to respond to water-based medical and fire emergencies, and provide support for search and rescue operations delivering crews with life saving medical care and fire suppression capabilities rapidly to remote areas and provide assistance for special water-based events.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The vessels will enable the creation of a new emergency response program consisting of two vessels manned by two medically trained firefighters operating 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The Fire/Rescue boats will operate from strategic areas to provide the greatest life and property saving impact. The intention is to mitigate tragedies on the water such as the death of Harlie A. Smith who died on August 11, 2017, in the Atlantic Ocean just a few miles from Cudjoe Key. While on vacation with her family of four, she was accidentally hit by a boat propeller. Medical assistance could not be provided in time on the water, and she died as a result. Additional resources will assist to avert these types of incidents.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The value to citizens is increased capacity to provide medical, life-saving and fire suppression services on the water. This will add protection for the many visiting boaters and their families, as well as our resident boaters, and waterfront recreational areas such as docks, marinas, and water based properties. Monroe County is surrounded by many small inhabited islands and fire rescue is extremely limited in its ability to reach these remote areas. These boats may also assist in time of evacuation of potentially impacted areas that have no connection to the roadways and provide a valuable resource following a disaster with entry within these areas.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population are those who work, live and visit within the Florida Keys. There are 26,500 registered vessels in Monroe County. Additionally, there is a significant impact from trailered boats vacationing in Monroe's waters from other communities, particularly the boating community of neighboring Miami-Dade County, with 73,663 registered vessels.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The primary benefit is a water-based lifesaving service that is currently not available to the community. The method will mirror that of our state incident reporting, for incident types, response times, and emergency response actions that are able to be performed solely through the incorporation of a marine emergency response unit.
