13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Lake Talquin and the Park are important economic drivers for Gadsden County. The improvements will make the Park more desirable and enjoyable for citizens and visitors.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The project site is located on Lake Talquin, Gadsden County, Florida. Lake Talquin is nationally known for its high quality black crappie (speckled perch) fishery. The lake has little vegetation, but tree stumps and logs provide an excellent nursery and habitat for many of North Florida's freshwater fish species, including black crappie, largemouth bass, bluegill, redear, white bass, and white striped bass. Lake Talquin is also one of Florida's deepest lakes, with an average depth of 15.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improve and enhanced ADA compliant amenities at the park. Camping: 7 new RV sites complete with hook-ups and concrete pads; construct a bathhouse with solar panels; expand/improve the septic system; purchase and install bike racks, new garbage/recycle cans, picnic tables, and benches; construct a Pavilion; improve parking areas and increase ADA parking; construct ADA sidewalks; construct a new ADA playground and refurbish existing playground equipment; construct a path around the Park for walking and biking; install directional and educational signage to educate visitors on Lake Talquin, fishing, native wildlife, and vegetation, etc

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Florida Citizens, tourist from the Midwest and Southeast United State, an estimated 500,000

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project has multiple benefits to not just Gadsden County but to the North Florida region as well. Eco-tourism and outdoor recreational opportunities are popular destination areas for residents and visitors alike. Outdoor recreational opportunities, such as the Pat Thomas Eco-Tourism Park, are important economic drivers in Gadsden County and the Florida Panhandle. Visitors traveling to the area purchase goods and services at local retail shops and grocery stores. Increase in bed tax dollars generated for Gadsden County.
