13. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Facility expansion on TSC property in Gadsden County to provide for four programs: First, an increase in the number of residents obtaining GED credentials. Second, expand healthcare education programs which will produce students with an industry certification and immediate employability. Third, grow the HVAC program to meet student demand. Fourth, replicate a successful Leon Country program for students with intellectual disabilities in Gadsden County to obtain employment credentials.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Construction of 8360 sf building to provide services to increase the number of students obtaining GED credentials; expand high-demand healthcare programs; expand successful HVAC program; and replicate successful program for students with intellectual disabilities to obtain employment credentials. All outcomes have quantitative metrics.

- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
- 1. GED Preparation programming, instruction, testing and support. 2. Expand healthcare and HVAC education programs to provide industry certification leading to jobs. 3. Expand Eagle Connections program for students with intellectual disabilities helping them earn employment employability skills.
- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Residents of Gadsden County who did not have a high school diploma.
Residents of Gadsden County seeking job skills for better employment opportunity and higher wages.
Residents who have developmental disabilities and would like to obtain job skills and an employability certificate to seek employment opportunities and independence.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increase the number of students obtaining a GED. Provide programs in Patient Care Tech, Health Care Tech, Patient Care Assistants, Nursing Aides and Orderlies, Home Health Aides, and Allied Health Assistants. Increase number of students obtaining HVAC credentials and employment. Increased independence and success for intellectually disabled individuals. For all programs, metrics include the number of participants, successful completions and employment.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

These funds are for facility expansion and operational funds. The purpose is to: a) increase the number of students obtaining GED credentials; b) expand the number of healthcare programs and participants culminating in successful completion of an industry certification; c) expand the successful HVAC program and d) create a program for students with intellectual disabilities to obtain employment credentials. All outcomes have quantitative metrics that can be included in a contract
