a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Poor drainage at several beachfront showers along A1A (a widely used corridor providing access to some of Jupiter's most popular beaches) has led to flooding and runoff issues into coastal dunes. This plan will replace deteriorating showers to improve drainage to reduce runoff, protect water quality, and enhance drainage functionality. Several beach showers along require replacement due to aging infrastructure, constant exposure to harsh beach conditions, and frequent use.

The project will fund design, engineering, permitting, and construction to replace and modernize aging beach side showers, drains, and water fountains along A1A. These upgrades will improve drainage functionality, enhance water conservation, and provide cleaner, more reliable public amenities that better serve residents and visitors.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The project will deliver improved public amenities that enhance the user experience and safety along the A1A beach front corridor. Residents and visitors will benefit from modern, well-functioning facilities that reduce standing water, and ensure dependable access to water and drainage systems.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The project will serve residents and visitors who utilize the public beach front corridor along A1A, estimated at more than 500,000 users annually. The improvements will support safe, accessible, and environmentally sustainable amenities for all ages while enhancing the Town’s coastal infrastructure.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

This project will enhance the overall functionality of the drainage system along A1A, while improving stormwater management, reducing flooding, and decreasing runoff issues into coastal dunes. Success will be measured with inspections, confirming proper water flow, and through public feedback, regarding improved visitor experience.
