The specific goal is to construct the project for the purpose of mitigating and reducing localized flooding and standing rainwater, enhancing protection of residential homes from flood events, increasing drainage capacity, reducing the probability of mosquito-transmitted diseases to the public, and protecting of private property and life in Miami Lakes' residential neighborhoods

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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Design, permit and construction of a new drainage system including new catch basins, manholes, drainage pipes, exfiltration trenches (French drains), milling and resurfacing of roadway, and signing and pavement markings.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The direct service will be increased drainage capacity and reduced street flooding in the drainage basin which will lessen impact to property of over 800 residential homes as well as maintaining the safety of an evacuation route and major North South connecting road in the Town.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

82nd avenue provides connections to several residential communities as well as the business district on NW 154th Street. The target population is the surrounding residential community as well as the general population of road users that utilize this facility. Increased drainage capacity in this area would directly impact over 800 properties.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected benefits include improved drainage, reduced localized flooding, increased drainage capacity, improved stormwater management, eliminated standing rainwater, reduced probability of mosquito-transmitted diseases to the public, reduced impact to property and life, enhanced environmental protection to the general public, improved transportation conditions, and improved groundwater and surface water quality. Outcome will be measured by field inspection and documentation of rainfall events. Project will create specific contractor, engineer, environmental, and consultant immediate job opportunities in stormwater and construction management measured by contractual agreements.
