WHEREAS, each year many Floridians are killed or injured in automobile accidents caused by drunk drivers, and

WHEREAS, on April 3, 1993, Zuly Reyes, age 17, the daughter of Gladys and Robert Saavedra, was killed by a drunk driver on the Palmetto access road (N.W. 167th Street, between Miami Lakes Drive and N.W. 67th Avenue in Miami Lakes), and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and appropriate that the Legislature of the State of Florida commemorate the location of this tragedy as a reminder to all drivers not to drink and drive, and

WHEREAS, Hernando County Deputy Sheriff Lonnie Coburn was murdered in the line of duty on February 21, 1978, at a convenience store at the intersection of State Road 50 and U.S. Highway 301, in Ridge Manor, Florida, and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and appropriate for the Legislature of the State of Florida to honor the memory of this courageous young man, and

WHEREAS, Florida Highway Patrol Trooper Robert G. Smith, a lifelong resident of Miami-Dade County, was killed in the line of duty on July 26, 1997, by a suspected drunk 31 driver, and

WHEREAS, Trooper Smith joined the Florida Highway Patrol in January 1993 and in December 1995 was appointed to the Tri-County DUI Task Force that patrols the highways of Miami-Dade, Broward, and Palm Beach Counties removing intoxicated drivers from our highways, and

WHEREAS, Trooper Smith was recognized by Mothers Against Drunk Driving on the local and statewide levels for 4 consecutive years and was a 4-year member of the prestigious Florida Highway Patrol One Hundred Club for removing over 100 drunk drivers annually from the roadways, and

WHEREAS, the memory of Trooper Smith should not be forgotten by the citizens of the state, and

WHEREAS, Ronald Wilson Reagan was the 40th President of the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, President Reagan was one of the United States' greatest and most beloved presidents and a true world leader, and

WHEREAS, through his leadership and refusal to compromise, President Reagan won the Cold War for America and virtually eliminated the threat of nuclear holocaust for all Americans, and

WHEREAS, President Reagan's economic policies brought Florida and the nation out of double-digit inflation and economically crushing high interest rates into 92 consecutive months of economic growth, and

WHEREAS, President Reagan's unbridled optimism gives Floridians and the nation cause to feel better about 31 ourselves, and
