Section 11.074, Florida Statutes, is 12 created to read: 11.074 Assessment of impact of legislation on 13 14 families. -- Before enacting any general or special law, each house of the Legislature must consider the impact of the 15 16 proposed legislation on the formation, maintenance, and general well-being of families consisting of those related by 17 blood, marriage, or adoption and living together. An impact 18 19 statement that assesses the potential effects of the proposed legislation in light of the following questions must be 20 21 written and made available to the public: 22 (1) In what ways would this legislation strengthen the stability of the family? 23 (2) Would this legislation strengthen the authority or 24 rights of parents in the education, nurturing, and supervision 25 26 of their children? 27 (3) Would the proposed benefits of this legislation 28 justify its impact on the family budget? 29 (4) What message, intended or otherwise, would this 30 legislation send to the public concerning the status of the 31 family?

1 2 A general law or special law shall not be declared invalid for 3 failure to comply with this section. Section 2. Paragraph (e) is added to subsection (2) of 4 5 section 120.54, Florida Statutes, to read: 6 120.54 Rulemaking.--7 (2) RULE DEVELOPMENT; WORKSHOPS; NEGOTIATED 8 RULEMAKING. --9 (e) Each agency, before adopting, amending, or 10 repealing a rule or formulating and implementing a policy, 11 must consider the impact of the proposed rule or policy on the formation, maintenance, and general well-being of families 12 consisting of those related by blood, marriage, or adoption, 13 and living together. An impact statement that assesses the 14 proposed rule or policy in light of the following questions 15 must be written and made available to the public: 16 17 1. In what ways would this rule or policy strengthen 18 the stability of the family? 19 2. Would this rule or policy strengthen the authority or rights of parents in the education, nurturing, and 20 21 supervision of their children? 3. Would the proposed benefits of this rule or policy 22 justify its impact on the family budget? 23 4. What message, intended or otherwise, would this 24 25 rule or policy send to the public concerning the status of the family? 26 27 Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 1998. 28 29 30 31

SENATE SUMMARY Requires the Legislature and state agencies to consider the impact of legislation or rulemaking on the formation, maintenance, and well-being of families. Requires impact statements to be written and made available to the public.
