Section 641.3155, Florida Statutes, is 14 created to read: 641.3155 Termination or nonrenewal of health care 15 16 provider contracts. -- All health care provider contracts 17 entered into after the effective date of this act shall include a provisional period of 1 year. During the 18 provisional period, or at the conclusion of the 1-year 19 20 provisional period, the contract may be terminated by either party without cause or explanation. Such contracts shall be 21 for a minimum period of 2 years unless an extended time period 22 is agreed to by both parties. After the provisional 1-year 23 period has expired without action on the part of either party, 24 such contracts may be terminated only for cause or by mutual 25 26 consent of both parties. Each contract shall include the conditions or terms that would constitute cause for 27 28 termination of the contract. All health care provider 29 contracts between the same parties shall include only one provisional period. All future health care provider contracts 30 between those parties shall not include the provisional period

and may be terminated only for cause or by mutual consent of both parties. For purposes of this section, "health care provider" is defined as any practitioner licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 460, or chapter 461, and any facility licensed under chapter 395. Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1 of the year in which enacted.
