Section 402.319, Florida Statutes, is 20 amended to read: 402.319 Penalties.--21 22 (1) It is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, for any 23 person willfully, knowingly, or intentionally to: 24 25 (a) (1) Fail, by false statement, misrepresentation, 26 impersonation, or other fraudulent means, to disclose in any 27 application for voluntary or paid employment or licensure 28 regulated under ss. 402.301-402.318 all information required 29 under those sections or a material fact used in making a 30 determination as to such person's qualifications to be child

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care personnel, as defined in s. 402.302, an owner, operator,

employee, or volunteer in a child care facility, family day care home, or other child care program.

 $\underline{\text{(b)}(2)}$  Operate or attempt to operate a child care facility without having procured a license as required by this act.

 $\underline{(c)}$  (5) Operate or attempt to operate a family day care home without a license or without registering with the department, whichever is applicable.

 $\underline{(d)}$  Operate or attempt to operate a child care facility or family day care home under a license that is suspended, revoked, or terminated.

(e)(4) <u>Misrepresent</u> Represent, by act or omission, a child care facility or family day care home to be duly licensed pursuant to this act without being so licensed.

- (f) Make any other misrepresentation, by act, regarding the licensure or operation of a child care facility or family day care home to a parent or guardian who has a child placed in the facility or is inquiring as to placing a child in the facility, including, but not limited to, any misrepresentation as to:
- 1. The number of children at the child care facility or the family day care home;
- 2. The part of the child care facility or family day care home designated for child care;
- 3. The qualifications or credentials of child care personnel;
- 4. Whether a family day care home or child care facility complies with the screening requirements of s. 402.305; or
- 5. Whether child care personnel have the training as required by s. 402.305.
