Animal owners could be reluctant to have 24 their animals vaccinated against rabies for fear of receiving 25 26 unwanted sales solicitations. An increase in the number of 27 unvaccinated animals would hinder the ability of animal control authorities to protect the public against the spread 28 29 of rabies and endanger the public health, safety, and welfare. 30 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming 31 law.
