majority party and a member of the minority party of their 1 2 respective houses. (c) The Commissioner of Education shall appoint five 3 4 members, including a math or science teacher, a member of the 5 Enterprise Florida Board of Directors, a member of the 6 National Science Program, a member of the Florida School Board 7 Administrators Association, and a member of the Postsecondary 8 Education Planning Commission. 9 (3) The commission shall be staffed by the Postsecondary Education Planning Commission and the Florida 10 Commission on Education Reform and Accountability.
