Costin, Sr., was born in Lyons, Georgia, and 11 12 WHEREAS, he moved to the area of Port St. Joe, Florida, in 1910 where he spent the remainder of his life, and 13 14 WHEREAS, on July 19, 1922, he married Lola Pridgeon, who became his life-long companion as they reared a family, 15 16 ran the family businesses, and served with great distinction 17 within the community, especially in their church, and WHEREAS, Cecil G. Costin, Sr., continued to work in and 18 19 manage his business until his 100th birthday, which he 20 celebrated with his hundreds of friends and relatives 21 approximately three weeks before his death, and 22 WHEREAS, the exemplary life lived by Cecil G. Costin, 23 Sr., and his great works of charity and Christian living, were 24 a great example and an inspiration to the people of Port St. 25 Joe and the surrounding area, NOW, THEREFORE, 26 27 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 28 29 Section 1. That portion of State Road 71 extending 30 through Port St. Joe (known as 5th Street) is designated the "Cecil G. Costin, Sr. Boulevard."
