Paragraph (c) is added to subsection (15) 14 of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, 1996 Supplement, to 15 read: 121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases 16 17 as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth 18 unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: 19 (15)20 (c) Effective January 1, 1998, "special risk member" means a member of the Florida Retirement System who is 21 22 designated as a special risk member by the division in 23 accordance with s. 121.0515. Such member must be employed as a law enforcement officer, a firefighter, a correctional 24 officer, an emergency medical technician, or a paramedic and 25 26 must meet certain other special criteria as set forth in s. 27 121.0515. 28 Section 2. Subsections (1) and (2) and paragraph (a) 29 of subsection (7) of section 121.0515, Florida Statutes, are 30 amended to read: 31

5 (1) LEGISLATIVE INTENT. -- In creating the Special Risk 6 Class of membership within the Florida Retirement System, it 7 is the intent and purpose of the Legislature to recognize that 8 persons employed in certain categories of law enforcement, 9 firefighting, and criminal detention, and emergency medical care positions are required as one of the essential functions 10 of their positions to perform work that is physically 11 12 demanding or arduous, or work that requires extraordinary agility and mental acuity, and that such persons, because of 13 14 diminishing physical and mental faculties, may find that they 15 are not able, without risk to the health and safety of themselves, the public, or their coworkers, to continue 16 17 performing such duties and thus enjoy the full career and 18 retirement benefits enjoyed by persons employed in other 19 positions and that, if they find it necessary, due to the physical and mental limitations of their age, to retire at an 20 earlier age and usually with less service, they will suffer an 21 economic deprivation therefrom. Therefore, as a means of 22 23 recognizing the peculiar and special problems of this class of employees, it is the intent and purpose of the Legislature to 24 establish a class of retirement membership that awards more 25 26 retirement credit per year of service than that awarded to other employees; however, nothing contained herein shall 27 require ineligibility for special risk membership upon 28 29 reaching age 55.

30 (2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special31 risk member, must meet the following criteria:

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(a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement 1 2 officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 3 compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected 4 police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification 5 requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's 6 duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, 7 apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law 8 violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb 9 disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member 10 must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or 11 12 members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited 13 14 to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be 15 16 included;

17 (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with 18 19 s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of 20 the employer or agency of state government. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene 21 fighting of fires or direct supervision of firefighting units, 22 23 or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, 24 however, administrative support personnel, including, but not 25 26 limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities 27 are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not 28 be included; or

(c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's

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primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and 1 physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates 2 within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, 3 4 or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being 5 transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command 6 officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; 7 provided, however, administrative support personnel, 8 including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and 9 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, superintendents and 10 assistant superintendents shall participate in the Special 11 12 Risk Class; or. 13 (d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance 14 Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified 15 in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's 16 17 primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene emergency medical care. However, administrative support 18 19 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 20 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 21 personnel shall not be included. 22 (7) RETENTION OF SPECIAL RISK NORMAL RETIREMENT 23 DATE.--(a) A special risk member who is moved or reassigned 24 25 to a nonspecial risk law enforcement, firefighting, or 26 correctional, or emergency medical care administrative support position with the same agency, or who is subsequently employed 27 in such a position with any law enforcement, firefighting, or 28 29 correctional, or emergency medical care agency under the Florida Retirement System, shall earn credit for such service 30 at the same percentage rate as that earned by a regular 31

member. Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (4), 1 service in such an administrative support position shall, for 2 3 purposes of s. 121.091, apply toward satisfaction of the 4 special risk normal retirement date, as defined in s. 5 121.021(29)(c), provided that, while in such position, the 6 member remains certified as a law enforcement officer, 7 firefighter, or correctional officer, emergency medical 8 technician, or paramedic; remains subject to reassignment at 9 any time to a position qualifying for special risk membership; and completes an aggregate of 10 or more years of service as a 10 designated special risk member prior to retirement. 11 12 Section 3. The Legislature finds that a proper and 13 legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees 14 of the state and of its political subdivisions, and the dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and 15 retirees, are extended the basic protections afforded by 16 17 governmental retirement systems that provide fair and adequate benefits and that are managed, administered, and funded in an 18 19 actuarially sound manner, as required by s. 14 of Art. X of 20 the State Constitution and part VII of chapter 112 of the 21 Florida Statutes. Therefore, the Legislature hereby determines and declares that the provisions of this act 22 23 fulfill an important state interest. Section 4.
