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A bill to be entitled An act relating to public funds; providing for the appropriation of revenues obtained as a result of the settlement of litigation involving the tobacco industry; providing for specified amounts to be appropriated to the Department of Health to continue implementing the Florida Kids Campaign Against Tobacco Pilot Program; providing for additional appropriations of revenues to be used for marketing, education and training, youth programs, and community partnerships; providing an appropriation to the Department of Business and Professional Regulation; requiring that such funds be used to enforce laws governing access to and possession of tobacco products by underage persons; providing for an evaluation of the pilot program; providing for program coordination and administrative support; providing an appropriation to the Working Capital Fund; providing an effective date. WHEREAS, the use of tobacco products has been demonstrated to have serious and adverse effects on personal health, and WHEREAS, it has further been demonstrated that when tobacco use begins prior to adulthood, the potential for adverse health effects is increased, and

WHEREAS, the children and youth of Florida have been subjected to extensive advertising and marketing efforts by

the tobacco industry to encourage their use of tobacco products, and

WHEREAS, the state of Florida was successful through settlement of litigation in requiring the tobacco industry to accept financial responsibility for costs to the state of Florida associated with remediating the adverse health effects of its products and preventing future generations of Floridians from suffering such adverse effects, and

WHEREAS, a portion of the proceeds from the settlement agreement has been designated for a pilot project to reduce tobacco use among Florida's children and youth, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Kids Campaign Against Tobacco Pilot Program was initiated during fiscal year 1997-1998 to address youth tobacco acceptability and accessibility through implementation of a comprehensive and coordinated tobacco education and enforcement program, and

WHEREAS, funds designated in the settlement agreement for implementation of the Florida Kids Campaign Against Tobacco Pilot Program are not available for application to any other public purpose, and

WHEREAS, the amount of \$70 million to support implementation in fiscal year 1998-1999 of the Florida Kids Campaign Against Tobacco Pilot Program may be paid only pursuant to the passage of this act, NOW THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. The lump sum of \$70 million is appropriated from tobacco settlement revenues to the Department of Health to continue implementation of the Florida Kids Campaign

Against Tobacco Pilot Program in fiscal year 1998-1999.

Section 2. <u>Funds provided in section 1 of this act</u> shall be distributed in the following manner:

- (1) Twenty-six million dollars shall be provided to the Department of Health for marketing and communications.

 These funds are to be used for a media campaign to create and promote messages urging youth to live tobacco free; for advertising, production, research, advertising compensation, public relations, and promotion of the campaign; for entering into cooperative agreements with the private sector for joint marketing arrangements; for youth media training; and for Internet support.
- Department of Health for education and training. These funds are to be used for a comprehensive tobacco education and training initiative directed toward Florida's children and youth, from prekindergarten through grade 12. The initiative is to be created through collaborative efforts between state agencies, local communities, voluntary agencies, school districts, professional organizations, and the State University System, and should emphasize intensive, interactive, and coordinated anti-tobacco curricula. These funds are to be used for leadership seminars, statewide voluntary organization education projects, science museums, prevention grants, leadership institutes, youth sports activities, and visual and performing arts programs.

 partnerships. In order to receive funding from this
 appropriation, each program must demonstrate that the funds
 will be used for purposes directly associated with the Florida
 Kids Campaign Against Tobacco Pilot Program and that funds

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will be used primarily for services and not for administrative activities. Oversight of all funds provided under this subsection will be the responsibility of the Department of Health. The department must approve all partnership and program plans, must oversee all contract activities, and may only release funds to each program or partnership after a determination has been made that all requirements have been met. The department, in consultation with the Office of Planning and Budgeting of the Executive Office of the Governor, must develop procedures for releasing and monitoring the use of funds provided under this subsection, including, at a minimum, an application process and an evaluation protocol to determine the effectiveness of community partnerships in reducing tobacco use among teens.

- (4) Five million dollars shall be provided to the Department of Health for implementing a statewide minority network to implement initiatives that specifically address the needs of African Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans, and other minority populations.
- (5) Six and one-half million dollars shall be provided to the Department of Business and Professional Regulation for enforcement of laws against underage tobacco access and possession through a combination of program development, research, and contracts with local law enforcement agencies. These funds are to be used for placing enforcement agents in retail locations, especially those located near schools and other areas where youth gather, to deter youth from purchasing tobacco and to train retail employees. Funds are also to be used for law enforcement training and equipment to provide a toll-free number for reporting retailers who provide tobacco

 to youth and to create a program to address the problem of false identification.

- (6) Two million dollars shall be provided to the Department of Business and Professional Regulation for education, training, marketing, and communication. These funds are to be used to develop a model retailer compliance education and training program, provide law enforcement school-based education programs in all school districts, develop a model education curriculum for possession-law education, provide communication materials designed to inform the public about youth tobacco laws, and develop retail compliance materials that encourage voluntary compliance.
- (7) Four million dollars shall be provided to the Department of Health for evaluation of each aspect of the pilot program. The statewide evaluation protocol must include instruments and procedures for data collection to document changes in attitudes, beliefs, and behaviors related to tobacco use in relation to the activities of each community partnership. The protocol must also include assessments of all programs prior to their inception, at the midpoint of their implementation, and after they are completed. Based on results from the midpoint evaluation, the statewide evaluator will make recommendations to the department as to whether the program should be continued, changed, or eliminated.
- (8) Three and one-half million dollars shall be provided to the Department of Health for program coordination and administrative support. Pursuant to section 216.262(1)(a), Florida Statutes, the Executive Office of the Governor may create up to 24 positions in the Department of Business and Professional Regulation and the Department of Health may use up to 31 positions that are currently authorized to ensure

financial integrity, program accountability, and coordinated management of all activities associated with the Florida Kids 2 3 Campaign Against Tobacco Pilot Program in fiscal year 1998-1999. Positions established or redirected pursuant to 4 5 this subsection are to be vacated and held in reserve by the 6 Executive Office of the Governor upon completion of the Florida Kids Campaign Against Tobacco Pilot Program. Funds 7 8 shall be transferred to the appropriate categories within the named departments by budget amendment subject to section 9 10 216.177, Florida Statutes. 11 Section 3.
