Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 11 893.12, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 12 893.12 Contraband; seizure, forfeiture, sale.--13 (1) All substances controlled by this chapter and all 14 listed chemicals, which substances or chemicals are handled, 15 delivered, possessed, or distributed contrary to any 16 17 provisions of this chapter, and all such controlled substances or listed chemicals the lawful possession of which is not 18 established or the title to which cannot be ascertained, are 19 declared to be contraband, are subject to seizure and 20 confiscation by any person whose duty it is to enforce the 21 22 provisions of the chapter, and shall be disposed of as 23 follows: (a) Except as in this section otherwise provided, the 24 25 court having jurisdiction shall order such controlled substances or listed chemicals forfeited and destroyed. 26 record of the place where said controlled substances or listed 27 28 chemicals were seized, of the kinds and quantities of controlled substances or listed chemicals destroyed, and of 29 30 the time, place, and manner of destruction shall be kept, and a return under oath reporting said destruction shall be made

to the court or magistrate and to the United States Drug Enforcement Administration by the officer who destroys them. Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law. SENATE SUMMARY Deletes the requirement that, when an officer destroys seized controlled substances in compliance with a court order, a copy of the record of the destruction be sent to the United States Drug Enforcement Administration.
