17	Section 14. Paragraph (b) of subsection (4) of section		
18	372.57, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:		
19	372.57 Licenses and permits; exemptions; fees.--No		
20	person, except as provided herein, shall take game, freshwater		
21	fish, or fur-bearing animals within this state without having		
22	first obtained a license, permit, or authorization and paid		
23	the fees hereinafter set forth, unless such license is issued		
24	without fee as provided in s. 372.561. Such license, permit,		
25	or authorization shall authorize the person to whom it is		
26	issued to take game, freshwater fish, or fur-bearing animals		
27	in accordance with law and commission rules. Such license,		
28	permit, or authorization is not transferable. Each license or		
29	permit must bear on its face in indelible ink the name of the		
30	person to whom it is issued and other information requested by		
31	the commission. Such license, permit, or authorization issued		

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1 by the commission or any agent must be in the personal  
 2 possession of the person to whom issued while taking game,  
 3 freshwater fish, or fur-bearing animals. The failure of such  
 4 person to exhibit such license, permit, or authorization to  
 5 the commission or its wildlife officers, when such person is  
 6 found taking game, freshwater fish, or fur-bearing animals, is  
 7 a violation of law. A positive form of identification is  
 8 required when using an authorization, a lifetime license, a  
 9 5-year license, or when otherwise required by the license or  
 10 permit. The lifetime licenses and 5-year licenses provided  
 11 herein shall be embossed with the name, date of birth, the  
 12 date of issuance, and other pertinent information as deemed  
 13 necessary by the commission. A certified copy of the  
 14 applicant's birth certificate shall accompany all applications  
 15 for a lifetime license for residents 12 years of age and  
 16 younger.

17 (4) In addition to any license required by this  
 18 chapter, the following permits and fees for certain hunting,  
 19 fishing, and recreational uses, and the activities authorized  
 20 thereby, are:

21 (b)1. Management area permits to hunt, fish, or  
 22 otherwise use for outdoor recreational purposes, land owned,  
 23 leased, or managed by the commission or the State of Florida  
 24 for the use and benefit of the commission, up to \$25 annually.  
 25 Permits, and fees thereof, for short-term use of land which is  
 26 owned, leased, or managed by the commission may be established  
 27 by rule of the commission for any activity on such lands.  
 28 Such permits and fees may be in lieu of or in addition to the  
 29 annual management area permit. Other than for hunting or  
 30 fishing, the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply on  
 31 any lands not owned by the commission, unless the commission

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1 shall have obtained the written consent of the owner or  
2 primary custodian of such lands.

3 2. A recreational user permit fee to hunt, fish, or  
4 otherwise use for outdoor recreational purposes, land leased  
5 by the commission from private nongovernmental owners, except  
6 for those lands located directly north of the Apalachicola  
7 National Forest, east of the Ochlockonee River until the point  
8 the river meets the dam forming Lake Talquin, and south of the  
9 closest federal highway. The fee for this permit shall be  
10 based upon economic compensation desired by the landowner,  
11 game population levels, desired hunter density, and  
12 administrative costs. The permit fee shall be set by  
13 commission rule on a per-acre basis. On property currently in  
14 the private landowner payment program, the prior year's  
15 landowner payment shall be used to augment the landowner lease  
16 fee so as to decrease the permit fee for the users of that  
17 property. The spouse and dependent children of a permittee are  
18 exempt from the permit fee when engaged in outdoor  
19 recreational activities other than hunting in the company of  
20 the permittee. Notwithstanding any other provision of this  
21 chapter, there are no other exclusions, exceptions, or  
22 exemptions from this permit fee. The landowner lease fee, less  
23 an administrative permit fee of up to \$25 per permit, shall be  
24 remitted to the landowner as provided in the lease agreement  
25 for each area.

7           provided by a public agency or nonprofit  
8           organization; amending s. 259.101, F.S.;  
9           revising the date that certain unencumbered  
10          funds in the Preservation 2000 Trust Fund will  
11          be redistributed; amending s. 372.57, F.S.;  
12          providing for a recreational user permit fee to  
13          hunt, fish, or otherwise use for outdoor  
14          recreational purposes, land leased by Game and  
15          Fresh Water Fish Commission from private  
16          nongovernmental owners; providing for the sale  
17          of specified lands by the Board of Trustees of  
18          the Internal Improvement Trust Fund; providing  
19          for the deposit of funds from the sale;
