7-1448-98 A bill to be entitled 1 2 An act relating to public records; creating s. 3 440.108, F.S.; providing an exemption from 4 public records requirements for certain 5 information obtained in administering the 6 Workers' Compensation Law; providing for the 7 applicability of confidentiality provisions; authorizing the furnishing of information under 8 9 certain conditions; providing penalties for violations; providing for future review and 10 repeal; providing a finding of public 11 12 necessity; providing a contingent effective 13 date. 14 15 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 16 17 Section 1. Section 440.108, Florida Statutes, is created to read: 18 19 440.108 Confidentiality of information revealing 20 identity of employing units or of individuals. -- Information 21 revealing the identity of an employing unit or of an 22 individual which is obtained from the employing unit or from any individual pursuant to the administration of this chapter, 23 and any determination revealing such information, must, except 24 25 to the extent necessary for the proper presentation of a claim 26 or upon written authorization of the claimant who has a 27 workers' compensation claim pending, be kept confidential and 28 is exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State 29 Constitution. Such information may be made available only to 30 public employees in the performance of their public duties. Disclosure of such information as is necessary to the 31

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1 division's compliance and enforcement procedures does not violate this prohibition. Any person, including, but not 2 3 limited to, an employee of the division, who receives such 4 confidential information and violates this section commits a 5 misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. б 775.082 or s. 775.083. This exemption is subject to the Open 7 Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2003, unless 8 9 reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the 10 Legislature. Section 2. The Legislature finds that the exemption 11 from the public records law which is provided in section 1 of 12 this act is a public necessity in that the harm caused by 13 14 releasing such information outweighs any public benefit that 15 might be derived from releasing the information. Information contained in such records is of a sensitive and personal 16 17 nature, could be used to discriminate against the person to whom the record pertains, and could cause harm to the person's 18 19 professional reputation. Section 3. This act shall take effect on the effective 20 date of Senate Bill , or similar legislation, relating to 21 the powers of the Division of Workers' Compensation of the 22 23 Department of Labor and Employment Security. 24 \*\*\*\*\*\* 25 SENATE SUMMARY 26 27 Provides an exemption from public records requirements for information obtained in administering the Workers' Compensation Law which reveals an employing unit's or an individual's identity. Provides for applicability of the confidentiality provisions. Authorizes the furnishing of information in specified circumstances. Provides for future review and repeal.
