An act relating to child care; establishing a child care tuition assistance program; providing for allocation of state and federal funds and distribution to families of eligible children; requiring the Department of Education and the Department of Children and Family Services to establish eligibility requirements for children and quality standards for child care centers; requiring a simplified point of entry to child care services; providing for rules; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. (1) There is established a child care tuition assistance program to be administered jointly by the Department of Education and the Department of Children and Family Services. Under this program state and federal funds available for child care shall be allocated to local entities, including district school boards and community child care coordinating agencies, for distribution to families of children eligible to participate in the program. Allocations shall be based on a uniform value for tuition assistance, to be determined by the Department of Education and the Department of Children and Family Services, and the expected number of children to be served.

28 (2) The Department of Education and the Department of

requirements for receipt of full tuition assistance or partial

31 tuition assistance based on family income.

1	(3) A family may use the tuition assistance to pay for
2	child care at any child care center designated by the
3	Department of Education or the Department of Children and

5	participation in the tuition assistance program, a child care
6	center must meet the quality standards developed jointly by
7	the departments. These standards must include, but not be
8	limited to, developmentally appropriate programming,
