Subsection (9) of section 440.15, Florida 19 20 Statutes, is amended to read: 21 440.15 Compensation for disability.--Compensation for 22 disability shall be paid to the employee, subject to the limits provided in s. 440.12(2), as follows: 23 24 EMPLOYEE BECOMES INMATE OF INSTITUTION. -- In case (9) an employee becomes an inmate of a public institution, then no 25 26 compensation shall be payable unless she or he has dependent 27 upon her or him for support a person or persons defined as 28 dependents elsewhere in this chapter, whose dependency shall 29 be determined as if the employee were deceased and to whom compensation would be paid in case of death; and such 30 31

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compensation as is due such employee shall be paid such 1 2 dependents during the time she or he remains such inmate. 3 (a) The state shall be entitled to reimbursement, 4 pursuant to the medical reimbursement schedule for all medical 5 treatment rendered an inmate related to his on-the-job injury. б (b) This subsection shall not apply to workers' 7 compensation benefits required under s. 946.006(4). 8 Section 2. Paragraph (j) is added to subsection (15) of section 414.095, Florida Statutes, to read: 9 10 414.095 Determining eligibility for the WAGES 11 Program.--(15) PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS.--12 13 (j) All temporary cash assistance and services 14 pursuant to this chapter provided to a person in this state 15 shall be terminated immediately when that person becomes an 16 inmate in any prison or other correctional institution. Section 3. Subsection (6) is added to section 414.32, 17 Florida Statutes, to read: 18 19 414.32 Prohibitions and restrictions with respect to 20 food stamps. --(6) TERMINATION OF FOOD STAMP BENEFITS TO 21 22 INMATES.--All food stamp benefits provided to a person shall be terminated immediately when that person becomes an inmate 23 24 in any prison or other correctional institution. 25 Section 4. Subsection (9) is added to section 409.903, 26 Florida Statutes, to read: 27 409.903 Mandatory payments for eligible persons.--The 28 department shall make payments for medical assistance and related services on behalf of the following persons who the 29 department determines to be eligible, subject to the income, 30 31 assets, and categorical eligibility tests set forth in federal 2

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and state law. Payment on behalf of these Medicaid eligible 1 2 persons is subject to the availability of moneys and any 3 limitations established by the General Appropriations Act or chapter 216. 4 5 (9) All medicaid services provided to an eligible 6 person pursuant to this section shall be terminated 7 immediately when that person becomes an inmate in any prison 8 or other correctional institution. Section 5. Subsection (6) is added to section 409.904, 9 10 Florida Statutes, to read: 11 409.904 Optional payments for eligible persons.--The 12 agency may make payments for medical assistance and related 13 services on behalf of the following persons who are determined 14 to be eligible subject to the income, assets, and categorical eligibility tests set forth in federal and state law. Payment 15 16 on behalf of these Medicaid eligible persons is subject to the availability of moneys and any limitations established by the 17 General Appropriations Act or chapter 216. 18 19 (6) All medical assistance and related services 20 provided to an eligible person pursuant to this section shall be terminated immediately when that person becomes an inmate 21 22 in any prison or other correctional institution. 23 Section 6.
