trapped under debris as the result of a natural or manmade disaster, or who are drowning victims. (2) Any person who knowingly and willfully and without lawful cause or justification inflicts great bodily harm, permanent disability, or death upon a police dog, or fire dog, SAR dog, or police horse commits a felony of the third degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084. Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 1997. SENATE SUMMARY Declares it to be a third-degree felony to harm, disable, or kill an SAR dog, as defined.
